THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

Laetare Sunday

The Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday, is a day of celebration within the more austere period of Lent. While violet is the penitential color of Lent, on this day, the vestments worn by the priest are rose colored, to remind us to rejoice. Laetare Sunday gets its name from the first words of the Introit (traditional Latin entrance) for the Mass of the day, taken from Isaiah 66:10:

Laetare Jerusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam: gaudete cum laetitia, qui in tristitia fuistis: ut exsultetis, et satiimini ab uberibus consolationis vestrae. (Psalm) Laetatus sum in his, quae dicta sunt mihi: in domum Domini ibimus. Gloria Patri.

Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her: rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow: that you may exult, and be filled from the breasts of your consolation. (Psalm) I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be to the Father.

The Joy of Returning to the Father's House

The Fourth Sunday of Lent marks the midpoint in the Lenten journey towards Easter. Traditionally, it is called "Laetare Sunday" (Rejoice Sunday). It is a sign of what the liturgical tradition calls "anticipatory joy", which is a reminder that we are moving swiftly toward the end of our Lenten fast, and the joy of Easter is already on the horizon.

The readings invite us to experience joy by reconciling ourselves with God through repentance and the confession of our sins, on one hand, and on the other hand, by celebrating our coming home to be with our loving and forgiving God. In the first reading, the People of God celebrate their new-found freedom for the first time in their own land, the feast of their freedom in the Promised Land. They are called to celebrate the Passover in remembrance of liberating wonders. In today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 34), a rejoicing Psalmist invites us, "Glorify the Lord with me; let us together extol His Name!" In the second reading, St. Paul invites the Corinthian Christian community to rejoice because Jesus has reconciled them with God by his suffering and death. The Gospel of Luke narrates the story of the Prodigal Son. His "homecoming" is celebrated by his forgiving and loving father. He throws a big party in his honor and celebrates the return of his son, where he is reconciled with himself, his father, his family, his community, and his God. The gospel also portrays the behavior of his self-righteous elder brother who becomes angry because of the loving and merciful treatment showed to his repentant young brother. St Luke invites us to see ourselves in the loving and forgiving father, the repentant son or the angry and jealousy elder brother.

Lent is a time to return to God admitting that we are a community of repentant, sinful people, who are now ready to receive God's forgiveness. The joy of returning to God is fully realized in the celebration of the mass: "Holy Mass enhances our "pass over," from a world of sin to a world of reconciliation. At every Mass, we come to our loving Heavenly Father's house as prodigal children acknowledging that we have sinned ("I confess to Almighty God"). In the Offertory, we give ourselves back to the Father, and this is the moment of our surrendering our sinful lives to God our Father. At the consecration, we hear God's invitation through Jesus: "... this is My Body, which will be given up for you... this is the chalice of My Blood ... which will be poured out for you..." In Holy Communion, we participate in the banquet of reconciliation, thus restoring our full relationship with God and our fellow human beings." (From Fr. Tony's homilies). Let us rejoice as we anticipate the overflowing joy of Easter through our return to and encounter with God through the sacrament of Reconciliation this Thursday, April 3, at 7 pm, as well as mass celebrations and Lenten practices.

La alegría de volver a la casa del Padre

El cuarto domingo de Cuaresma marca el punto medio del camino cuaresmal hacia la Pascua. Tradicionalmente, se le llama "Domingo de Laetare" (Domingo de la Alegría). Es un signo de lo que la tradición litúrgica llama "alegría anticipada", que nos recuerda que nos acercamos rápidamente al final de nuestro ayuno cuaresmal y que la alegría de la Pascua ya se vislumbra en el horizonte.

Las lecturas nos invitan a experimentar la alegría reconciliándonos con Dios mediante el arrepentimiento y la confesión de nuestros pecados, por un lado, y por otro, celebrando nuestro regreso a casa para estar con nuestro Dios amoroso y misericordioso. En la primera lectura, el Pueblo de Dios celebra su nueva libertad por primera vez en su tierra, la fiesta de su libertad en la Tierra Prometida. Están llamados a celebrar la Pascua en memoria de las maravillas liberadoras. En el Salmo Responsorial de hoy (Salmo 34), un salmista jubiloso nos invita: «Glorifiquemos al Señor conmigo; alabemos juntos su nombre». En la segunda lectura, San Pablo invita a la comunidad cristiana de Corinto a regocijarse porque Jesús los ha reconciliado con Dios mediante su sufrimiento y muerte. El Evangelio de Lucas narra la historia del Hijo Pródigo. Su regreso a casa es celebrado por su padre, compasivo y amoroso. Organiza una gran fiesta en su honor y celebra el regreso de su hijo, donde se reconcilia consigo mismo, con su padre, su familia, su comunidad y su Dios. El Evangelio también describe el comportamiento de su hermano mayor, que se cree santurrón y se enoja por el trato amoroso y misericordioso que recibe su hermano menor arrepentido. San Lucas nos invita a vernos reflejados en el padre amoroso y compasivo, el hijo arrepentido o el hermano mayor enojado y celoso.

La Cuaresma es un tiempo para volver a Dios, reconociendo que somos una comunidad de personas arrepentidas y pecadoras, listas para recibir su perdón. La alegría de volver a Dios se realiza plenamente en la celebración de la misa: «La Santa Misa enriquece nuestra transición de un mundo de pecado a un mundo de reconciliación. En cada misa, llegamos a la casa de nuestro amoroso Padre Celestial como hijos pródigos reconociendo que hemos pecado («Me confieso ante Dios Todopoderoso»). En el ofertorio, nos entregamos al Padre, y este es el momento de entregar nuestras vidas pecaminosas a Dios Padre. En la consagración, escuchamos la invitación de Dios a través de Jesús: «...este es mi Cuerpo, que será entregado por ustedes... este es el cáliz de mi Sangre... que será derramado por ustedes...». En la Santa Comunión, participamos en el banquete de la reconciliación, restaurando así nuestra plena relación con Dios y con nuestros semejantes». (De las homilias del P. Tony). Regocijémonos al anticipar la alegría desbordante de la Pascua con nuestro regreso y encuentro con Dios mediante el sacramento de la Reconciliación este jueves 3 de abril a las 19:00 h, así como con las celebraciones de la misa y las prácticas cuaresmales.




GRUPO DE ADOLESCENTES SAN JOSELITO

Pro-Life Update April 2025

There has been a significant legal development in an issue discussed in previous Pro-Life Updates dealing with a federal law which requires hospitals with an emergency department to "stabilize the medical condition" of any patient seeking emergency treatment or to transfer the patient to another facility. That law is the 1986 Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act (EMTALA) which was enacted to prevent 'patient dumping,' i.e. hospitals refusing to treat patients who are unable to pay. After the Supreme Court's Dobbs case was decided in 2022 the individual states were allowed to decide for themselves whether to allow, prohibit, and/or regulate abortion. Thereafter many states prohibited or greatly restricted abortions and the federal government, under President Biden, sought to use EMTALA to hamper the efforts of the states which enacted laws to reduce or eliminate abortion. Essentially, the Biden administration took the legal position that EMTALA's provision that hospitals "stabilize" the medical condition of pregnant women preempted state law and required physicians to perform abortions under certain circumstances in spite of the state laws and the personal conscience beliefs of the doctors.

See the August 2024 Pro-Life Update regarding one such situation. The state of Idaho adopted a law which prohibited abortions except those intended to prevent the death of the pregnant woman. The federal government filed suit against Idaho claiming that EMTALA preempted that Idaho law and required Idaho hospitals to perform abortions, not only to prevent the death of the mother but also to prevent "serious harm" to her health. The U.S. Supreme Court refused to rule on the merits of that suit but merely sent the case back to the lower court for additional proceedings.

The same question, whether EMTALA preempts state laws prohibiting abortions, was raised again in the case of *Becerra v. Texas* which was decided by the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit on January 2, 2024. Two weeks after the Dobbs case was decided the federal Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) issued written "Guidance" to state healthcare agency directors that: if a state law prohibits abortion; a pregnant patient seeks emergency medical treatment; and "abortion is the stabilizing treatment necessary to resolve that condition, the physician must provide that treatment." The State of Texas and two associations of physicians brought suit claiming that this "Guidance" exceeded HHS's authority, was contrary to Texas state law, and should be enjoined. The federal district court agreed and issued an injunction against enforcement of the HHS "Guidance." The Court of Appeals agreed with the district court and stated that "the question is whether EMTALA, according to HHS's Guidance, mandates physicians to provide abortions when that is the necessary stabilizing treatment for an emergency medical condition. It does not." The Appellate Court further explained that "EMTALA does not provide an unqualified right for the pregnant mother to abort her child." HHS sought review of this ruling by the Supreme Court, but that request was denied. Therefore, the pro-life ruling by the Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit stands.


